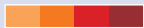


UN appeal for urgent Yemen aid

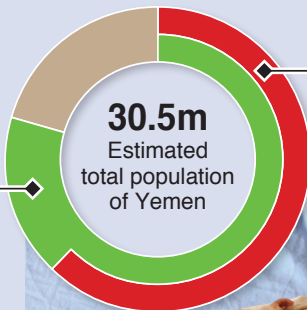
