

Where can you go on holiday in Europe?

As European countries start to lift coronavirus lockdown restrictions, many people across the continent have begun thinking about whether they can have a holiday this summer

Selected destinations



1 Croatia

Borders open to citizens of Germany and nine other mostly east European EU countries. Other EU nationals need paid reservation to enter

2 Bulgaria

Lifted 14-day quarantine on Jun 1, except for tourists from eight countries heavily affected by pandemic, including UK, Spain and Italy

3 Italy

Borders opened Jun 3 to European visitors

4 Austria

Opened borders to all neighbouring countries on Jun 4, except Italy

5 Portugal

People from all European countries except Spain and Italy can enter freely

6 UK

14-day quarantine imposed from Jun 8 for all people arriving from abroad (except from Ireland)

7 Cyprus

Will allow visitors from 19 European countries in two phases, from Jun 9 and Jun 20. Visitors from UK and Russia remain barred for now

8 Germany

Lifting travel ban for European countries from Jun 15

9 France

Borders opening Jun 15. Visitors from some countries may be subject to quarantine

10 Greece

Allowing flights to Athens and Thessaloniki from Jun 15. People arriving from countries deemed high risk will be tested and potentially quarantined

11 Netherlands

Borders opening Jun 15 – initially, only to tourists from 12 EU countries with lower rates of Covid-19

12 Spain

Reopening to international tourism from Jul 1
