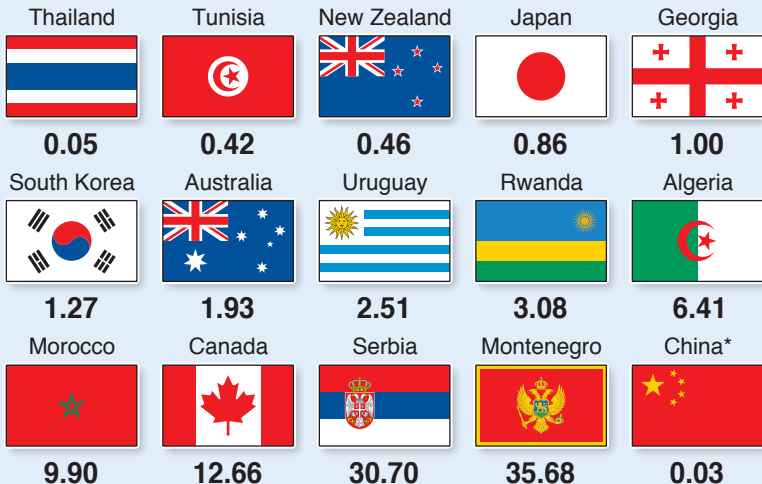


EU allows visitors from “safe” countries

The European Union has opened its borders to non-essential travellers such as tourists and most business people from a “safe” list of 14 countries, excluding the United States, Brazil, Russia and Turkey

“SAFE” COUNTRIES: Figures indicate number of Covid-19 cases per 100,000 people over previous 14 days (*as of July 1*)



Note: List to be reviewed every two weeks. *Will be included if it allows in EU visitors

■ **Case numbers:** Should be comparable per 100,000 people to those in EU over previous 14 days (EU average is around 16)

■ **Pandemic control:** As well as having stable or decreasing trend of new infections, countries must meet EU requirements on virus testing, surveillance, contact tracing and treatment, and general reliability of virus data

■ **Non-EU states:** Switzerland, Iceland, Liechtenstein and Norway are considered “safe”

■ **UK:** Enforces 14-day period of self-isolation on all non-essential travellers, although its residents are free to travel to many EU countries. UK visitors to France asked to carry out 14-day voluntary quarantine. Greece banning flights from Britain until mid-July
