July 27, 1980

▲ **Muhammad Reza Shah Pahlavi, the exiled Shah of Iran, died of cancer in Cairo, Egypt. The Shah, who ruled Iran from 1941, was forced to flee his country in 1979**

1830: An uprising in Paris on the “Day of the Barricades” forced the unpopular King Charles X to abdicate

1955: Austria regained sovereignty after 17 years of foreign occupation

1995: Footprints preserved in volcanic ash proved that humans were walking upright 3.7 million years ago

2013: The first Przewalski’s horse foal, a wild horse that became extinct in the wild in 1960s, was born via artificial insemination
