▲ Colombian cyclist Egan Bernal won the Tour de France. He was the first Latin American rider to win the Tour, and at age 22, the youngest winner since 1909

1945: A B-25 bomber lost in fog slammed into New York's Empire State Building, killing 14 people

1995: India's Maharashtra state renamed the city of Bombay as Mumbai, after the Hindu goddess Mumbadevi

1996: The bones of a prehistoric man some 9,000 years old were discovered in the U.S. state of Washington
