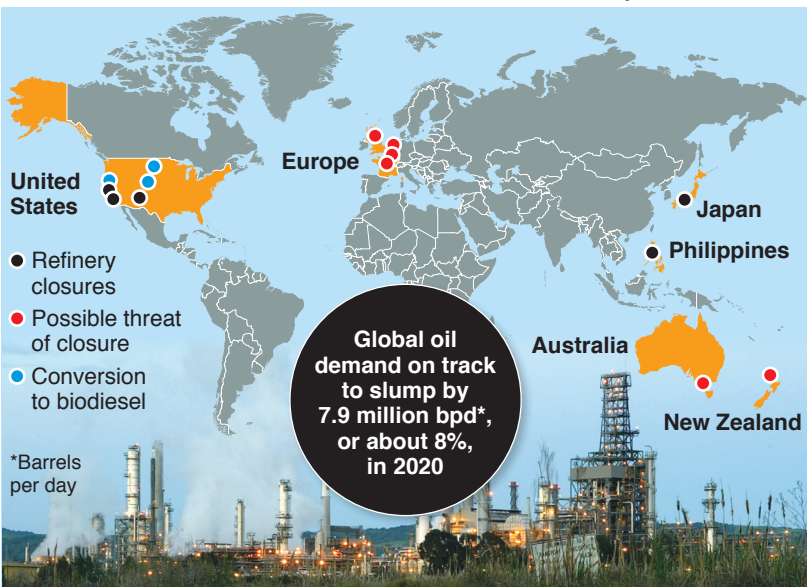


Oil refiners close plants amid demand slump

Oil refiners are shutting down processing plants in Asia and North America, and facilities in Europe could be next, as global fuel demand remains below levels seen before the coronavirus pandemic



UNITED STATES

■ **Marathon** plans to halt refining at Martinez, California, and Gallup, New Mexico

■ **Phillips 66** to close refinery in Santa Maria, California, in 2023

■ **Phillips 66** refineries in Rodeo, California, and Dickinson, North Dakota, to become biodiesel plants

■ **HollyFrontier** facility in Cheyenne, Wyoming, to produce biodiesel

EUROPE

■ **Belgium: Gunvor Group** could mothball 110,000-bpd refinery in Antwerp

Other plants on list of potential closures

■ **France: Total's** 102,000-bpd Grandpuits refinery

■ **Netherlands** 377,000-bpd **BP** facility in Rotterdam

■ **UK: Petroineos'** 200,000-bpd plant in Grangemouth, Scotland

ASIA-PACIFIC

■ **Japan:** Planned closure of 115,000-bpd **JXTG Holdings** Osaka refinery in 2021

■ **Philippines: Royal Dutch Shell** to shut 110,000-bpd Tabangao facility

■ **Australia: Viva's** 120,000-bpd Geelong refinery at risk

■ **New Zealand Refining NZ's** only plant could become fuel import terminal
