▲ **Mao Zedong and his Communist forces ended their Long March at Yan'an, in northwest China, a year after fleeing Chiang Kai-shek's Kuomintang armies in the south**

1960: The obscenity trial of Penguin Books, publishers of D.H. Lawrence's novel *Lady Chatterley's Lover*, began

1968: America's former First Lady Jacqueline Kennedy married Greek tycoon Aristotle Onassis

1973: Sydney Opera House, designed by Danish artist Joern Utzon, was officially opened

1993: The Dutch government said it would ban the sale of hashish and marijuana to foreign tourists
