▲ **China ended its controversial one-child policy after 35 years, allowing married couples to have two children as a way to offset the country's ageing workforce**

1945: The first commercially successful ball point pen sold over 7,000 units in the U.S. on its first day

1998: John Glenn, 77, returned to space aboard the shuttle Discovery, 36 years after he first orbited Earth

2010: Unexploded bombs hidden in printer cartridges were found on two separate U.S-bound cargo planes

2018: A Boeing 737MAX 8 crashed after taking off from Jakarta, killing all 189 people on board
