▲ **Salvador Allende was sworn in as President of Chile, becoming the first Marxist to be elected president of a liberal democracy in Latin America**

1986: It was revealed that the U.S. had been secretly selling weapons to Iran to secure the release of seven American hostages, despite an arms embargo

1992: Bill Clinton was elected as President of the United States

2005: A week of violent unrest in the immigrant-dominated suburbs of Paris spread across France

2015: Australian jockey Michelle Payne became the first woman to win the Melbourne Cup
