▲ Myanmar's military government began moving all ministries from the historic city of Yangon (Rangoon) to a new, purpose-built capital at Nay Pyi Taw

1965: Cuba and the U.S. formally agreed to begin an airlift for Cubans wanting to go to the United States

1975: Over 350,000 Moroccans crossed into Western Sahara as King Hassan claimed the territory from Spain

1975: British punk band the Sex Pistols played their first gig at St Martin's College of Art in London

1990: Nawaz Sharif was sworn in as Pakistan's new prime minister amid charges of vote-rigging
