▲ A third “mega-leak” in 2010 by the website WikiLeaks published confidential documents from the U.S. State Dept. to its diplomatic missions around the world

1950: An estimated 200,000 Chinese troops poured over the River Yalu as China entered the Korean War

1975: The left-wing Fretilin movement declared East Timor independent from Indonesia after a brief civil war

2000: The Netherlands became the first country in the world to legalise euthanasia
