

Pipeline route for Azeri gas to Europe

The Trans-Adriatic Pipeline is the final leg of a \$40 billion project named the Southern Gas Corridor, which will allow Azerbaijan to deliver natural gas directly to European markets

ROUTE OF SOUTHERN GAS CORRIDOR (SGC)

Three pipelines with total length of 3,500km. Project aims to reduce European Union's reliance on Russian gas supplies

SGC connects to European gas grid near San Foca in southern Italy



Trans-Adriatic Pipeline (TAP)

Length: 878km

Operational
Mid-Nov 2020

Annual capacity
10 billion cubic metres (bcm) of gas – enough to power 7 million European households. Capacity could be increased to 20bcm

Trans-Anatolian Pipeline (TANAP)

Length: 1,850km

Operational
Jun 2018

Annual capacity
16bcm initially – 6bcm to Turkey and 10bcm to Europe via TAP. Capacity could be expanded to 31bcm based on demand

South Caucasus Pipeline (SCP)

Length: 692km

Operational
2006

Annual capacity
Expected to reach 23bcm, which would triple current capacity. Pipeline connects to TANAP at Georgia-Turkey border
