January 5, 1841

▲ An expedition led by British explorer James Clark Ross was the first to enter Antarctic pack ice. The Ross Sea and Ross Ice Shelf were later named after him

1896: The first public account of Wilhelm Roentgen's discovery of X-rays was published in Austria

1971: One-day cricket was born when the Test match between England and Australia was curtailed due to rain

2001: The Beatles' landmark album Revolver was judged the best album in rock 'n' roll history
