

EU rebuffs latest British fish offer

British Prime Minister Boris Johnson has offered a fresh proposal on fishing rights aimed at saving €735.6 billion in EU-UK bilateral trade.

The two sides are haggling over just €78.6 million of fish

Exclusive Economic Zones (EEZs of UK and neighbouring coastal states)

EU catch in UK waters (2018): €785.7 million

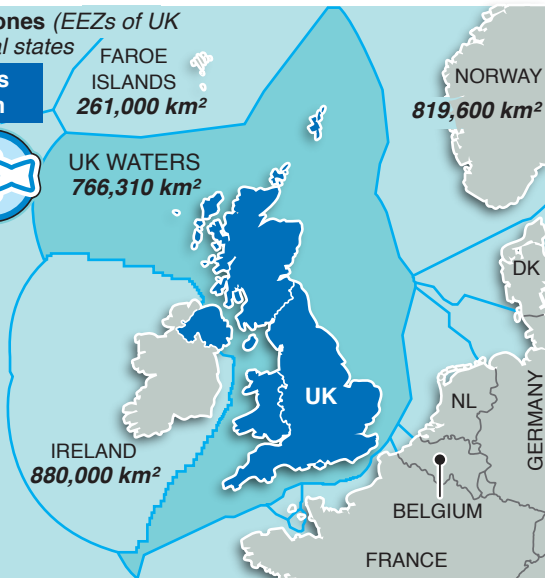
■ **Nov 27:** EU's chief Brexit negotiator **Michel Barnier** proposes EU fleets retain **85%** of catch. Just 15% of EU quota to be phased out over 10 years
Value: €667.8 million

■ **Dec 18:** EU insists retaining **75%** of catch over eight years is final offer
Value: €589.3 million

■ **Dec 20:** UK offers **60%** of pre-Brexit catch
Value: €471.4 million

■ **Dec 21:** Latest UK offer gives EU **65%** of its quota over five years, with disputes settled by independent arbitration
Value: €510.7 million

■ **Dec 22:** European Union rejects UK's latest concessions on fishing
