

U.S., EU sanctions on Russia over Navalny

The U.S. and European Union have imposed sanctions on nine Russian officials accused of playing a role in the poisoning and subsequent jailing of prominent opposition politician Alexei Navalny



● **U.S. sanctions:** Assets of seven officials frozen and U.S. citizens barred from dealing with them

● **EU sanctions:** Travel ban and asset freeze on four officials

Jan 2021: Navalny (*left*) arrested in Moscow upon returning from Germany, where he spent five months recovering from nerve-agent poisoning that he blames on Kremlin. Russian authorities reject accusation



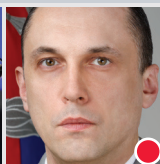

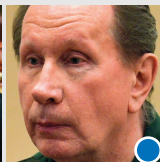
