Just three golfers have claimed four or more Masters titles. Iconic Green Jacket – tailored for each individual champion – remains at Augusta at all times and is reused for each subsequent victory

Green Technology

Engineering helps to maintain Augusta's luxuriant turf and lightning-fast greens

Playing surface: Creeping *Bentgrass* cut to 3.2mm

Sandy root zone

Gravel

Native soil

Aeration: Warm or cool air regulates temperature, aerates soil

Drainage: Water sucked from soil

SubAir system: 25hp pump drives air at up to 70,000 litres/min through subsurface ducts

Masters: Destination Georgia

1931: Site purchased from *Fruitland Nurseries*. Course designed by *Bobby Jones* (inset) and *Alister MacKenzie*

1934: Horton Smith wins first *Augusta National Invitation Tournament*

First *Par 3* contest held on eve of Masters. Popular event is reputedly jinxed – no golfer has yet won *Par 3* and Masters in same year

South African *Gary Player* (right) is first non-American to win Masters

1964: *Arnold Palmer* (below left) is first player to win four Masters titles

1980:
Spain's *Seve Ballesteros* (right) is first European champion

Jack Nicklaus wins record sixth Masters

Chasing Greatness

Tiger Woods will miss 2021 Masters after sustaining serious leg injuries in car crash. His 15th major title in 2019 – arguably among best ever sporting comebacks – closed gap to all-time record of 18 held by Jack Nicklaus
