ARMS CONTROL / CONFLICTS

Moscow and Washington have accused each other of breaching security agreements and scrapped key accords. **New START** treaty – renewed in February – is last remaining arms control pact

Tensions persist over conflicts in Syria, Libya and Ukraine, where over 100,000 Russian troops massed near border in April



PRISONER SWAP

Biden likely to call for release of U.S. Marine **Paul Whelan (1)** – jailed for espionage – and **Trevor Reed**, U.S. citizen charged with assaulting Russian police officers while drunk

Moscow could ask for release of Russian arms dealer **Viktor Bout (2)**, and alleged drug trafficker **Konstantin Yaroshenko**

WORKING TOGETHER

U.S. and Russia could collaborate on issues such as coronavirus pandemic, climate change, nuclear programmes in Iran and North Korea, and war in Afghanistan
