▲ A right-wing extremist killed 77 people in two terror attacks in Norway, a car bomb in central Oslo and shootings at a political youth camp on the island of Utoya

1946: Bread rationing was introduced in Britain as a result of shortages after World War II

1987: The Soviet Union offered to dismantle all of its short and medium range missiles
