1929: Catalan artist Salvador Dali held his first one-man show in Paris

1961: Bob Dylan recorded his first album, "Bob Dylan", for Columbia. It sold 5,000 copies in the first year

1981: Anatoly Karpov retained the World Chess Championship, beating Viktor Korchnoi in Italy

2001: The U.S. State Department upped the reward for information leading to the capture of Osama Bin Laden from \$5m to \$25m
