▲ Tradition has it that the first Thanksgiving, a harvest feast shared by English colonists and the Native American Wampanoag people, was celebrated

1970: Writer Yukio Mishima committed ritual suicide in protest against the westernisation of Japan

1974: The Irish Republican Army was outlawed in Britain following two pub bombings in Birmingham

1989: Vietnamese boat people rioted in Hong Kong's detention camps at the news of enforced repatriation

2020: Football legend Diego Maradona, who inspired Argentina to World Cup glory in 1986, died aged 60
