

# Novak Djokovic deported from Australia

■ **Dec 10:** Cut-off date for players to apply to **Tennis Australia** for vaccine exemption

■ **Dec 14:** Djokovic attends Red Star basketball game in Belgrade at which numerous people later test positive

■ **Dec 16:** Rapid antigen test returns negative result; also takes PCR test. Attends ceremony unveiling stamp in his honour

■ **Dec 17:** Attends children's awards at **Tennis Association of Belgrade**. Receives positive PCR test result

■ **Dec 18:** Interviewed by **L'Équipe**, attends Champion of Champions awards photoshoot

■ **Dec 22:** Second PCR returns negative result

■ **Dec 25:** Pictured on social media playing street tennis in Belgrade, and with handball star **Petar Djordjic**

■ **Dec 31:** Pictured at Sotogrande tennis academy near Marbella, Spain

■ **Jan 1:** Authorises agent to submit travel declaration – Australian government issues Australia Travel Declaration for quarantine-free arrival

■ **Jan 2:** Receives border travel permit from **Victoria** state government

■ **Jan 4-5:** Flies from Madrid to Melbourne via Dubai



**Serb law requires 14 days isolation after positive test.** Djokovic's court statement and Tennis Australia Chief Medical Officer both confirm diagnosis on Dec 16

■ **Jan 6:** Australia cancels visa after confirmation of no vaccination

■ **Jan 10:** Federal Circuit Court judge overturns visa cancellation

■ **Jan 14:** Immigration minister Alex Hawke cancels Djokovic's visa on grounds of "health and good order"

■ **Jan 16:** Federal court upholds visa cancellation. Djokovic deported from Australia
