February 3, 1637

▲ Tulip mania collapsed in the Netherlands after soaring prices decimated sales. It is regarded as the first recorded speculative economic bubble

1992: Argentina opened the files on scores of Nazis who fled to South America after World War II

1992: PLO leader Yasser Arafat, 63, revealed he had married 28-year-old Suha Tawil in July 1990

2004: The first passenger train from Darwin to Adelaide completed its inaugural three-day trip

2017: A U.S. judge blocked President Donald Trump's "travel ban" from seven Muslim-majority nations
