March 28, 1930

▲ **Constantinople, capital city of the late Roman, Byzantine and Ottoman empires, was formally renamed Istanbul. Another Turkish city, Angora, became Ankara**

1939: The Spanish Civil War ended when fascist forces took Madrid

1979: A major disaster was narrowly averted after a partial meltdown in a nuclear reactor at the Three Mile Island power plant in the U.S.

2009: A Chinese spying network was found to have infiltrated more than 1,000 computers in 103 countries

2016: The FBI revealed they could access encrypted data on a suspect's iPhone without Apple's help
