March 31, 1492

▲ The joint Catholic Monarchs, Isabella of Castile and Ferdinand of Aragon, ordered the expulsion of all Jews from the Kingdom of Spain and its territories

1992: The UN imposed sanctions after Libya refused to hand over two men suspected of the Lockerbie bombing

1999: Prolific serial killer Anatoli Onoprienko was convicted of the murders of 52 people in Ukraine

2000: Mount Usu erupted in Japan, spewing hot rocks, gas and ash over the northern island of Hokkaido

2005: The UN said acute malnutrition in Iraq had almost doubled since the U.S.-led invasion of 2003
