▲ Archaeologists announced the discovery of the ancient Egyptian city of Aten, founded 3,400 years ago and the most important find since the tomb of Tutankhamun

1820: The Venus de Milo, one of the most famous works of ancient Greek sculpture, was discovered

1989: A Soviet nuclear submarine sank off the coast of Norway, killing 40 people, after a fire on board

1992: Genetic fingerprinting tests confirmed that Nazi war criminal Josef Mengele died in Brazil in 1979

2010: The New START treaty was signed, cutting the nuclear arsenals of the U.S. and Russia by a third
