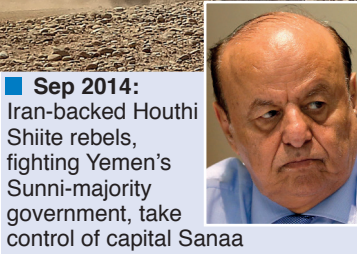


Seven years of war in Yemen

The Saudi-led coalition fighting Houthis in Yemen will halt military operations after seven years of war, following UN calls for a truce during the Muslim holy month of Ramadan



- Sep 2014:** Iran-backed Houthi Shiite rebels, fighting Yemen's Sunni-majority government, take control of capital Sanaa
- Jan 2015:** Rebels seize presidential palace – President **Abedrabbo Mansour Hadi** (above) resigns
- Mar 2015:** Saudi Arabian-led coalition launches military campaign against Houthis, with U.S. support
- Jul 2018:** Coalition blockades port city of Hodeida, stopping fuel and aid deliveries
- Dec:** U.S. Senate votes to invoke **War Powers Resolution** to force end to U.S. support of Saudi-led war
- Apr 2019:** President **Donald Trump** vetoes congressional bid to force end to U.S. participation in war
- Dec 2020:** At least 22 people killed and dozens wounded in Houthi attack on Aden airport. **Target is aircraft carrying President Hadi's new 24-member cabinet**
- Jan 19, 2021:** Trump administration uses airport attack to designate Houthis as **foreign terrorist organization**. Critics say FTO sanctions bar aid deliveries to civilians in war-torn nation
- Jan 20:** U.S. President **Joe Biden** inaugurated. He suspends sanctions, pledges to end U.S. support for war
- Mar 2022:** Ramadan truce agreed
