

Supreme Court overturns abortion rights



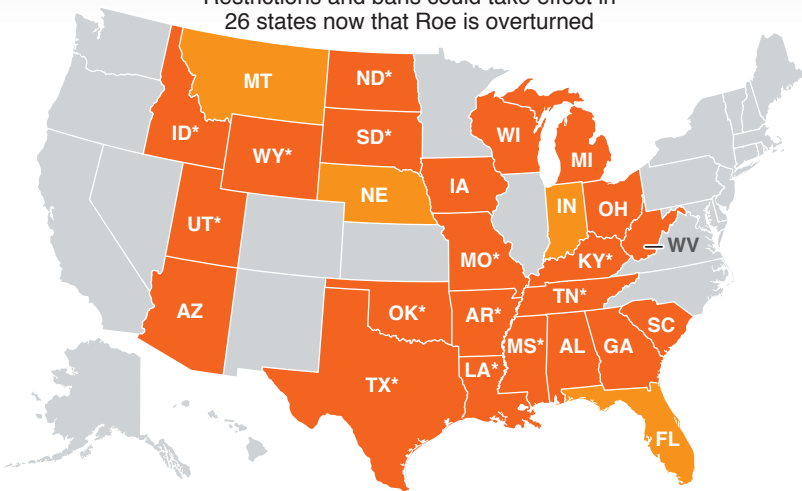
The U.S. Supreme Court has struck down the landmark 1973 *Roe v Wade* ruling, making it possible for individual states to ban abortion

Norma McCorvey: Original plaintiff – anonymised as **Jane Roe** – in 1973 *Roe v Wade* ruling, which made abortion legal across U.S. during first three months of pregnancy



ABORTION'S FUTURE

Restrictions and bans could take effect in 26 states now that *Roe* is overturned



Certain to ban abortion
22 states – including 13 states that have passed “trigger laws” ready to come into effect immediately, or very quickly, as *Roe* is struck down (identified with asterisk)

Alabama, Arizona, Arkansas*, Georgia, Idaho*, Iowa, Kentucky*, Louisiana*, Michigan, Mississippi*, Missouri*, North Dakota*, Ohio, Oklahoma*, South Carolina, South Dakota*, Tennessee*, Texas*, Utah*, West Virginia, Wisconsin, Wyoming*

Likely to ban abortion
Four states

Florida, Indiana, Montana, Nebraska
