Wimbledon 2022: Women's preview

Iga Swiatek, propelled to the World No.1 spot by the retirement of 2021 Wimbledon champion *Ashleigh Barty*, is bidding to become only the seventh woman to win Roland Garros and Wimbledon in the same year
