

Israel set for November election

As Israel heads for its fifth election in less than four years, polls show Benjamin Netanyahu's Likud bloc could win 58 of the Knesset's 120 seats but remain short of a governing majority

Benjamin Netanyahu: Likud party leader is seeking sixth term as prime minister despite being on trial for corruption on charges he denies

Partnership with **Yamina party** would enable Netanyahu to assemble majority coalition

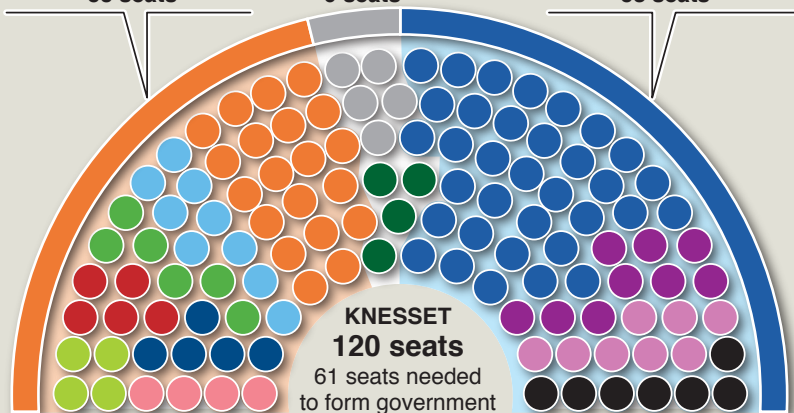
