Sanctions on Russia's arms companies and tycoons have been applied inconsistently by the U.S., UK and EU, as the Western allies fail to coordinate actions against makers of banned weapons

CEO of **High Precision Systems** – KBM parent company produces missiles, artillery, grenade launchers and machine guns

CEO of **Splav**, maker of Uragan rocket launcher system – used to fire cluster bombs in Ukrainian city of Kharkiv on Mar 24



Mikhail Shelkov
Vice chairman of **VSMPO-Avisma**, world's largest titanium supplier and 25 percent owned by Russian defence giant **Rostec**
