

Europe summer travel chaos

Strikes and staff shortages are causing airlines to cancel thousands of flights, leading to lengthy passenger queues at major airports



Heathrow:

Caps passenger departures at **100,000** per day



Aviation refuellers and **British Airways** staff call off strike action after accepting pay offers



Charles de Gaulle and Orly: 4,000

vacancies in security, maintenance and travel retail



Easyjet:

Spain-based cabin crew planning nine days of strikes unless they receive **40% pay increase**



Ryanair: Five-year agreement with pilots in France and Spain sees return to pre-Covid salaries



French airports:

Unions agree pay rises of up to **6%** for ground crew



Luton: Temporary flight disruptions after heatwave melts section of runway



Norwegian Air:

Agrees **3.7% pay rise** plus benefits for pilots



SAS: Unions reach wage deal, ending 15-day strike that grounded **3,700** flights



Schiphol:

Agrees to pay **15,000** cleaners, baggage handlers and security staff **€5.25** extra per hour during summer

KLM: Collective agreement sees pay rise of up to **4%** for ground crew



Lufthansa:

Ground crew demanding extra **€350** per month to mitigate effects of soaring inflation
