September 13, 1957

▲ The Agatha Christie mystery *The Mousetrap*, opened in 1952, became Britain's longest-running play. Now the world's longest, it is still going after almost 70 years

1982: Australia's "dingo baby" trial, in which Lindy Chamberlain was charged with the murder of her daughter, began

1997: The state funeral of Mother Teresa took place in Calcutta, India

2007: The McLaren F1 team was fined \$100m and lost all its points in the Constructors' Championship following the Spygate scandal

2007: The Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples was adopted by the United Nations
