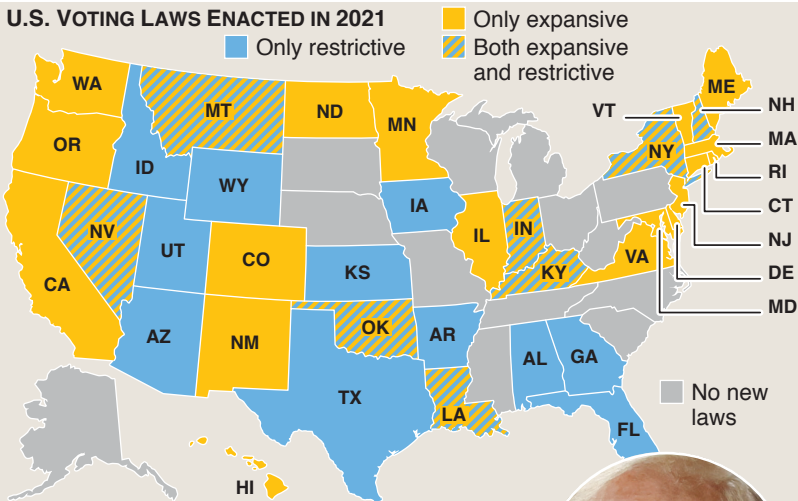


New laws could impact U.S. midterms

U.S. states have passed more than 30 laws since the 2020 election – most of them backed by Republican legislators – that could restrict voting access in November's midterm elections

EXAMPLES OF RESTRICTIVE VOTING MEASURES

■ Voter ID: Tougher requirements introduced in 10 states, including changes to ID rules for mail-in ballots in Georgia and Texas

■ Voter registration
New laws to facilitate de-listing of voters in seven states. Florida to clean up voter rolls every year instead of every two years

■ Mail-in voting
18 states have passed laws making it harder for voters to apply for, receive or cast ballots before election day

■ Election monitoring
Laws enacted in 25 states that take power from traditional election managers and, in many cases, cede control to partisan actors
