▲ **China ended its controversial one-child policy after 35 years, allowing married couples to have two children as a way to offset the country's ageing workforce**

1972: Guerrillas hijacked a German jet over Turkey, demanding the release of others held for the Olympic massacre

1982: Lindy Chamberlain was convicted of the murder of her baby daughter in the Australian outback. She was subsequently pardoned

1997: Iraq ordered all U.S. inspectors to leave the country within seven days

2007: The U.S. military handed over security to Iraqi authorities in the mainly Shia province of Karbala
