▲ **The Great Wall of China opened to tourists for the first time. The section that was opened was built in the Ming Dynasty, between 1368 and 1644**

1969: The long-running U.S. children's TV series Sesame Street began, combining comedy and puppetry

1983: U.S. student Fred Cohen demonstrated the working of a computer virus for the first time

1995: Writer and activist Ken Saro-Wiwa and eight of his associates were hanged in Nigeria

2009: A power failure blacked out much of Brazil due to a fault at the giant Itaipu hydro-electric dam
