

World Cup security in Qatar

With partners from 13 countries, Qatar security forces will deploy 49,000 government and private security personnel, plus international air and naval assets, to ensure security at the World Cup

■ Hamad International Airport:

U.S. Department of Homeland Security to identify air passengers linked to terrorism

■ Al-Udeid Airbase:

11,000 U.S. military personnel stationed at largest U.S. base in Middle East



■ Dukhan/Tamim Airbase:

12 Eurofighter Typhoons from joint UK-Qatar Emiri Air Force No 12 Squadron to provide counterterrorism and air security

■ Qatar security personnel: 32,000

Private security personnel: 17,000

■ National Security Centre:

Will monitor 15,000 security cameras, with facial recognition technology, at eight stadiums and throughout Doha



■ Qatari Navy:

Seven new ships including four Doha-class corvettes. New Italian-built Naval Operation Centre. Maritime security support from British Royal Navy



■ International support:

U.S.: SkyDome and DroneHunter counter-drone technologies

UK: Counter terrorism personnel

Turkey: 3,250 security guards including riot police, 100 special operations police, 50 bomb specialists

France: 200 gendarmes and police for crowd management

Pakistan: 72 combat troops

Czech Rep., Slovakia: NATO to provide support including biochemical defences
