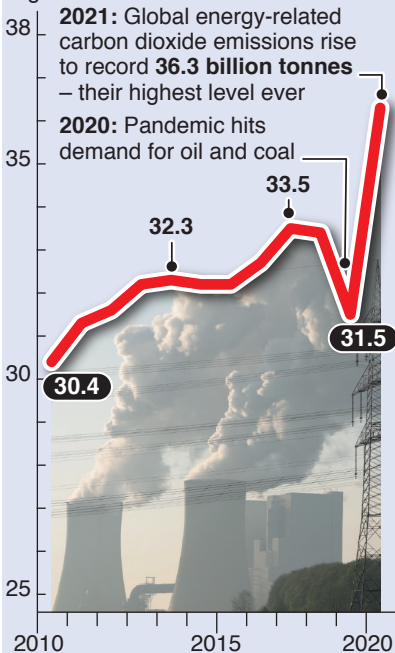


Little progress on climate pledges

Many pledges made at last year's COP26 summit – to phase-down coal and cut deforestation and methane emissions – have yet to be honoured. Only 24 countries have updated their emissions targets.

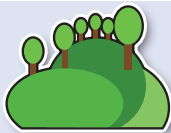


■ **Emission cuts:** At COP26, 151 countries pledge to improve “Nationally Determined Contributions.” United Nations Environment Programme warns pledges will have negligible effect on limiting global warming to 1.5°C

■ Deforestation:

145 countries pledge to cut deforestation by **10%** yearly from 2020.

Jan-Sep 2022: Deforestation of Amazon rises by 23%



■ Global methane pledge:

U.S., EU and 117 other countries pledge to slash methane emissions by **30%** from 2020 to 2030.

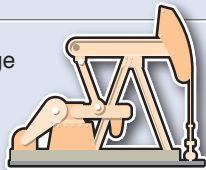
Only 15 countries have concrete plans to do so



■ Fossil fuels:

39 countries pledge to end public financing of fossil fuels by end of 2022.

Just six countries have turned pledges into action



■ Climate finance:

Pledge made in 2009 to provide **\$100 billion** a year to vulnerable countries by 2020.

Developed world claims finance reached \$83.3bn in 2020, but Oxfam estimates it was only \$24.5bn
