▲ **A 14-year-old boy with diabetes was successfully treated with insulin, a year after it was first isolated in Toronto by Frederick Banting and Charles Best**

1923: French and Belgian troops occupied the Ruhr after Germany failed to meet war reparations payments

1935: Amelia Earhart became the first person to fly solo from Hawaii to the continental United States

1943: The United States and Britain signed treaties with China, renouncing their extra-territorial rights

2013: French troops headed to Mali at the Malian government's request to halt an advance by Islamist rebels
