

Aid to Turkey and Syria



European Union: At least 13 member countries have offered assistance and around 370 rescuers. Copernicus satellite system to provide emergency mapping services



UK: 76 search and rescue specialists and emergency medical team to Turkey



UAE: Search and rescue teams and medical aid to Syria and Turkey



South Korea: \$1 million in aid to Turkey plus medicine, search and rescue team



India: Two 100-strong search and rescue teams with dogs



Switzerland: 80 rescuers with dogs to Turkey – clarifying assistance to Syria



Japan: 75-strong rescue team to Turkey



Australia: \$7 million in assistance to Turkey, Syria to receive \$3 million



New Zealand: \$632,000 to Turkey, \$316,000 to Syria



Roman Catholic Church: Has allocated \$537,800 for emergency aid



United States: Firefighters, structural engineers and sniffer dogs



Russia: Syria-based military to deploy 300 personnel to search for survivors. Moscow has also offered to send 100 rescuers to Turkey



Israel: Search and rescue team of 150 army engineers, medical personnel and aid workers to Turkey



Jordan: King Abdullah has ordered emergency aid to Syria and Turkey



Pakistan: Two C-130 aircraft dispatched with 36 search and rescue personnel



Mexico: Rescue personnel and equipment to Turkey



Qatar: \$6 million allocated for relief and shelters in Turkey and Syria. Distributing 27,000 hot meals



China: \$200,000 each to Turkish Red Crescent and Syrian Red Crescent

Others: Lebanon, Moldova, Montenegro and Serbia are sending 100 rescue workers to Turkey
