▲ Time magazine was launched in the United States. It has the largest circulation for a weekly news magazine, with a global readership of 26 million

1703: English scientist Robert Hooke, who discovered the law of elasticity, known as Hooke's law, died

1875: Bizet's opera *Carmen*, one of the world's most popular operas, was first staged in Paris

1933: The likelihood of a scientific link between sunburn and cancer was first made public in Australia

2003: Members of the Greek terror group November 17 went on trial in Athens for 23 murders
