▲ **Constantine II became King of Greece, reigning until 1973 when the monarchy was abolished. After years in exile Constantine died in Athens in January 2023**

1899: The German pharmaceutical company Bayer patented the headache relief drug Aspirin

1946: Ho Chi Minh agreed that Vietnam would be recognised as an autonomous state within French Indochina

1966: Australia agreed to send a 4,500-man task force to boost military commitment in South Vietnam

2003: The U.S. ratified the Strategic Offensive Reductions Treaty, reducing U.S. and Russian nuclear warheads
