

NATO pledges since Ukraine invasion

Germany is pushing to increase its defence budget by as much as €10 billion (\$10.7 billion) next year to help fund additional spending triggered by Russia's invasion of Ukraine



Boris Pistorius: Following invasion, German Defence Minister (*left*) announces boost in defence spending to over 2% of GDP



Poland: One of few countries already spending 2% of GDP on defence before invasion



UK: UK is expected to spend 2.1% of GDP on defence.
