

# Crowns for King Charles' coronation

Three crowns will be worn by King Charles III and Camilla, Queen Consort, during the ceremony at London's Westminster Abbey

## St Edward's Crown

Worn at moment of coronation

Made for **King Charles II** in 1661 to replace crown thought to have belonged to 11th Century **King Edward the Confessor** and destroyed in aftermath of English Civil War



Made of solid gold, 2.2kg crown has 444 gemstones, including rubies, sapphires, garnets and tourmalines



## Imperial State Crown

Worn towards end of ceremony, and at appearance on Buckingham Palace balcony

St Edward's Sapphire



Originally made for **King George VI** in 1937 to replace crown made for **Queen Victoria** in 1838



Crown was also worn by **Queen Elizabeth II** during her coronation in 1953

**Cullinan II**, 317-carat diamond

**Koh-i-Noor** set in crown for **Queen Mary's** coronation in 1911



**Black Prince's Ruby**

Crown to be reset with **Cullinan III, IV and V** diamonds from late Queen Elizabeth II's personal collection

India claims ownership of 105-carat jewel, which was given to Queen Victoria during the Raj
