March 12, 1933

▲ **U.S. President Franklin D. Roosevelt gave the first of his nationwide “fireside chats” on radio, explaining how he intended to tackle the financial crisis**

1913: Canberra became the official capital of Australia

1945: Jewish diarist Anne Frank, 15, died in the Nazi concentration camp at Bergen-Belsen, one month before it was liberated

1993: Nearly 200 people were killed when up to 13 bombs exploded across the Indian city of Bombay. Buildings targeted included the stock exchange

2003: Serbian Prime Minister Zoran Djindjic was assassinated in Belgrade
