▲ Dust storms threatened many “dust bowl” states in the U.S. mid-west, bringing calls for the government to declare the region a disaster area

1713: The Treaty of Utrecht ended the War of the Spanish Succession and redrew the map of Europe

1961: U.S. folk singer Bob Dylan made his first live appearance

1976: The original Apple computer created by Steve Wozniak and Steve Jobs went on sale for \$666.66

1984: Australia adopted Advance Australia Fair as the official national anthem and designated green and gold as the national colours
