▲ Queen Elizabeth announced she would open Buckingham Palace to the public to finance fire-damage repairs to Windsor Castle. Around 400,000 people visit it each year

1993: South Africa's President F.W. de Klerk apologised for the nation's 45-year apartheid regime

1993: Lloyds of London, facing losses of £6 billion, announced a drastic reorganisation

2003: Apple's iTunes Music Store, the world's number one music store, opened on the internet

2008: UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon established a task force to tackle the world food crisis
