▲ The state of Madhya Pradesh in central India was designated as the “Tiger State” to protect the threatened animal from poachers and settlers

1948: The Yugoslav Communist Party was expelled from the rest of Europe’s Communist bloc

1992: U.S. surgeons transplanted a baboon’s liver into a human being. The patient survived for 70 days

1995: Nelson Mandela ordered an investigation into human rights abuses during South Africa’s apartheid era

2010: Ten alleged members of a Russian spy-ring were charged in the U.S. with acting as foreign agents
