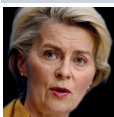


G7 Hiroshima Summit at a glance

WHAT'S ON THE AGENDA?

- **Ukraine:** G7 will seek to show unity in support to Kyiv and increase economic pressure on Russia through broader export bans
- **China:** U.S. pushing for stronger strategy to slow China's technological advance, reduce West's economic dependency, and counter Beijing's belligerence towards Taiwan
- **Artificial intelligence:** EU lawmakers urging G7 leaders to find ways to control AI amid rapid ascendancy of chatbot **ChatGPT**
