▲ **Bread rationing in Britain came to an end. It was imposed in July 1946 as a result of shortages after World War II, although bread was not rationed during the war itself**

1963: The U.S., Soviet Union and Britain agreed to ban nuclear tests in the atmosphere, outer space and under water

1978: The world's first "test-tube baby", conceived by the process of in vitro fertilization (IVF), was born

2003: Scientists reported that the first human migration to the Americas took place no later than 18,000 years ago

2018: Former cricketer Imran Khan became prime minister of Pakistan after a general election marred by violence
