

Documents in Trump's indictment

The indictment against Donald Trump accuses him of storing 31 classified documents in unsecured areas of his Florida resort. Agencies, including the Pentagon, CIA, National Security Agency and National Reconnaissance Office, produced the documents

Instead of using **Sensitive Compartmented Information Facility (SKIF)**, 27 classified documents are found in Trump's Mar-a-Lago office and 75 are found in storage area

CLASSIFICATION MARKS: All documents have clear markings shown in banner line, at top and bottom of document

1 TOP SECRET//TK//NOFORN: Six top-secret documents marked **TK** – standing for **Talent Keyhole** – meaning data originated from U.S. spy satellites. **NOFORN** means document cannot be shared with foreign governments

2 TOP SECRET//ORCON/NOFORN: **ORCON** means that material cannot be disseminated outside U.S. government department that originated it, without approval
